- 1. Knowledge of the evolution of literature and culture from ancient times to recent times helps the students to understand the relationship between time and literature. As a result, they have a deep understanding to literary reading and literary criticism. It enables them to analyze and interpret the chemistry of culture and literature and society in texts.
- 2. This programme imparts a profound understanding in Bengali Language through the various stages of evolution and transformation in different perspectives. Students are then able to identify the patterns of linguistic changes and can detect the theoretical specialization of language in literary body.
- 3. Students of language are always inspired and encouraged to develop their writing and analytical and speaking skills. The communicative skills enable them to involve at a variety of literary works including research oriented works.
- 4. Students learn the norms and ethics of publication and data collection.

Charyapada, Baishanab Padabali, Ramayana, Mangal Kavya, Bhagabat, Mahabharata, Shakta Padabali and AnnadaMangal, Chandimangal, etc.

- 6. Students are enabled to transfer and apply the acquired concepts and principles to study different branches of Bengali literature that is fiction, short story, essay and poetry.
- 7. Understand the principles and application of classification of Drama, Novels and Poetry. Development of a conception of aesthetic sense and understand the interdisciplinary approaches.
- 8. The syllabus has been formed by keeping in mind success of the students in ideological, cultural, anthropological, socio-political and linguistics development.
- 9. Bengali literature of ancient, medieval and modern period, through reading, writing and research work, grown up their mental capabilities and thoughts.
- 10. Comparative analysis of vernacular language are developed by other neighbouring literature. Literary criticism presents their intelligence, skill and emotional development by this syllabus.
- 11. More specifically the practical utility of this programme may be evident from their participation in:
- a) Higher Studies (such as, M.A in Bengali/Linguistics/Comparative Literature) in reputed Universities.
- b) Special Course on journalism, advertising, print media and publishing house. These courses can also give him/ her an opportunity of employment.
- c) Eligibility through examination and or viva voce as teaching faculty at primary, secondary and higher secondary schools.
- d) After Graduation, students of Bengali will also be immensely suited for creative enterprises such as film, theatre, script- writing, editing and so on.
